Jesus had just told His disciples that He would die. How crushing this would've been to Mary! In love, she offered what she could in the moment. With His death imminent, it may have appeared to have been a small or meaningless gesture – but it was "a beautiful thing." When we love Jesus and desire to please Him, even the small things He appreciates.
