# When Jesus Singles You Out – John the Baptist

Not everything Jesus did and said has been recorded for us. "Now there are also many other things that Jesus did. Were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written" (Jn 21:25, ESV). So when Biblical authors make effort to record a distinct comment Jesus made about an individual, it is worth our attention. Why did Jesus single them out?

Jesus said of John the Baptist in Luke 7:28, "...among those born of women none is greater than John," a definitive statement. In the image of the great prophet Elijah, John was prophesized to come and prepare the way for the Messiah. Jesus would say John was "more than a prophet" in that his was a grand task – to prepare the way for Messiah and His kingdom. However, John died before this kingdom was ushered in. Therefore, Jesus said, "Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he." Are we greater than John the Baptist? Yes! We are living in the kingdom right now! We have the entire revealed word of God. We have the indwelling Spirit. We are the bride of Christ. These are things that John did not have. Jesus has singled *us* out. We have blessing and privilege that no other people on Earth have ever enjoyed – to the extent that even the least among us are greater than John the Baptist, himself.
