Can we overemphasize Jesus? Paul told the Corinthian church, "And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God. For I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified" (1 Cor 2:1-2, NKJV). Could we be so bold to have such a singular focus? Or do we too quickly run to the "finer points" of Christianity? Paul didn't. Paul put his emphasis where it belonged – on Jesus. Do not think that such an approach is unrefined, unnecessary, or too elementary. Satan's goal is to distract us from Jesus. This is such a danger that Paul was worried for the Corinthians: "But I fear, lest somehow, as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, so your minds may be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ" (2 Cor 11:3). Jesus is not a topic of Christianity that can be worn out. Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. There is no overemphasizing truth. There is no avoiding life. Jesus should always be the continual emphasis of His disciples.
