Jesus said to the Jews in John 5:39, "You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; it is these that testify about Me" (NASB). If you don't read Jesus when you read the Old Testament, you're missing the focus.

Heb 11:24-26 "By faith Moses ... considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward."

Jude 5 "Now I want to remind you, although you once fully knew it, that Jesus, who saved a people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe."
