Consider these weighty and explicit words, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love" (1 Jn 4:7-8, ESV). We must love one another to share in God's nature of love. The love of God and love for God is inextricably connected to the love for brother. Consider the following:

- **1 John 2:10** Whoever loves his brother abides in the light, and in him there is no cause for stumbling.
- **1 John 3:10** By this it is evident who are the children of God, and who are the children of the devil: whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is the one who does not love his brother.
- **1 John 3:14** We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we love the brothers. Whoever does not love abides in death.
- 1 John 3:16-17 By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?
- **1 John 4:11-12** Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us.

John summarizes this thought well towards the end of his letter, "If anyone says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother" (1 Jn 4:20-21).
