Christians are disciples of Christ. A disciple is a student or follower, but we can see beyond the is simple definition in the book of Luke. Luke has a lot to say about disciples and discipleship. (The next time you read Luke, note how many times disciple is used.) When all references to disciples in Luke are considered, we get a picture of devoted, respectful, eager learners who are called, instructed, and blessed by a teacher who has expectations of them. Two of Luke's discipleship passages are worthy of emphasis:

A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher. (Lk 6:40, ESV)

and

If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple... So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple. (Lk 14:26-27, 33)

Jesus is explicit – His disciples are to be fully committed and to be trained to be like Him. It seems heavy or even harsh, but one cannot argue with the clarity of His words. Jesus expects much from us. As disciples, however, we understand that this is a learning process. As Christians we are on a journey of becoming more and more like Jesus. This is our purpose as disciples of Christ.
