When Jesus went to His hometown to teach in the synagogue, those who heard Him took offense and said, "Where did this man get these things? What is the wisdom given to him? How are such mighty works done by his hands? Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?" (Mk 6:2-3, ESV). Jesus was astonished at their response (Mk 6:6).

How does that happen? How can Jesus Christ - how can God - be astonished? How is it He can marvel at anything? Does that mean that He is surprised? Impressed? Confused?

Later, when a Roman centurion requested that his servant be healed and said, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you come under my roof. Therefore I did not presume to come to you. But say the word, and let my servant be healed. For I too am a man set under authority, with soldiers under me: and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it" (Lk 7:6-8). Jesus marveled at this response, "and turning to the crowd that followed him, said, 'I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith'" (Lk 7:9).

It is incredible that Jesus shares with us the capacity to be astonished – a trait that seems so ignorantly human on the surface. It appears that, even with all the knowledge and wisdom He possesses, our Lord allows Himself to experience the choices of an individual in the moment. In those moments, Jesus, understanding humanity firsthand, recognizes those acts which occur in spite of their circumstances and beyond typical expectation. Jesus does this today. When you lose your job on Friday and praise Him on Sunday, He is astonished. He marvels when your child is very sick but you give thanks to Him for His provision. When, after hearing the gospel for the first time, you gave your life to Jesus in spite of your incredibly worldly background, Jesus was in wonder. What a joy and privilege it is to know that our Lord, our Beloved, our Creator, is astonished at US!
