Today, in my study of benevolence, I came across this verse and wanted to share it with you, for in it is the idea of seeing others and their needs.

Paul wrote in Galatians 2:10, reminiscing on the commandment that the apostles gave him and Barnabas, "They only asked us to remember the poor- the very thing I also was eager to do." Perhaps we need to underline the word eager in this verse to remind us of the attitude we should have when serving others - others in my community, nation, family, friends, neighbors, and the church. Serving others may not take away my anxiety but it will put my focus on where it should be. In John 13 we find Jesus washing the feet of His apostles, even the one who would lift his heel against Jesus (Ps 41:9). Jesus had a lot on his mind yet He focused on service. People in the world are choosing to say and do things that make things harder for everyone - the riots, looting, name-calling, cursing, blaming, and confusion.

How is your day? How is your social media? How is your time? Are we filling it with eagerness to serve or allowing the noise of a chaotic world to drown out the voice of Jesus?

"You know that those who are recognized as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them; and their great men exercise authority over them. But it is not this way among you, but whoever wishes to become great among you shall be your servant; and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and give His life a ransom for many." Mark 10:42-45

Jesus served, Paul and Barnabas served, the early church served, and today you and I as brothers and sisters in Christ serve despite the anxiousness of a world filled with chaos. Today, go out and be great by being a servant. Go out and be first by becoming a slave.
