His Name Means Savior

Let's take a look at the mocking that Christ endured while agonizing on the cross on Golgotha's hill. The gospel of Matthew records for us that the crowds, chief priests, scribes, elders, and even the two robbers crucified with him all hurled abuses at Him.

Matthew 27:40, "you who are going to destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, <u>save Yourself</u>..."

Matthew 42, "He saved others; <u>He cannot save Himself..."</u>
Matthew 27:43, "He trusts in God; <u>let God rescue Him</u> now If He delights in Him."

Just how emotionally draining it must have been for Jesus, whose name means Savior, to hear such insults. The whole purpose of Jesus being born into this world was to save us from our sins. We read this in Matthew 1:21, "She will bear a Son; and you shall call his name Jesus, for He, will save His people from their sins." Jesus' obedience to God and God's love for the world (John 3:16) compelled Him to be ridiculed, scourged, nailed to the cross, and to die all alone for you and I. Jesus wasn't here to save Himself, He was here to save you and I. Jesus could have saved Himself but chose not to. Perhaps you are ready to obey the gospel and wash away your sins, by being baptized into Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Don't leave here today without asking for a study on the truth-that Jesus came to save you. Are you ready to be saved?
